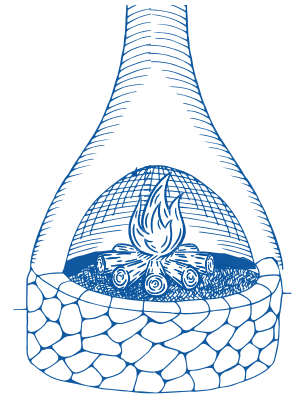
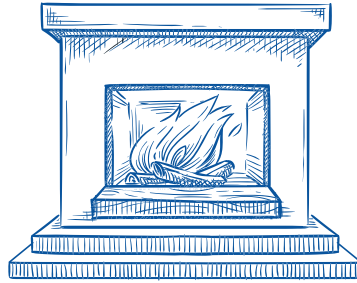

GAS VS. WOOD BURNING FIRE PITS

FIRE PITS

There are several differences between gas and wood fireplaces, but there's no "right" or "wrong" choice. The best option depends on your home, lifestyle and preferences. To determine which style best suits you, think about how often you'll use it, the atmosphere you'd like to create, the level of maintenance you have time for and your budget.



FEATURE	GAS FIREPLACE	WOOD FIREPLACE
HEAT OUTPUT	Provides steady, controllable heat; generally better for heating medium spaces efficiently.	Can produce strong radiant heat, but temperature is harder to control and depends on wood quality.
EXPERIENCE	Clean and simple, but less atmosphere, no crackle or woodsmoke smell.	Classic campfire feel with crackle, aroma and glow; more "cozy" experience.
EMISSIONS	Burns clean, releasing fewer pollutants and almost no smoke.	Produces smoke and CO ₂ ; modern fireplaces meet EPA standards but still less clean than gas.
EASE OF USE	Extremely convenient, just flip a switch; no storage or cleanup.	Requires effort to chop/buy wood, build fires, tend flames and clean ashes.
SAFETY	Consistent flame, no sparks, safer to run with minimal supervision.	Sparks, flying embers and hot logs require more supervision and caution.
MAINTENANCE	Needs annual inspection and cleaning; little to no daily upkeep.	Needs annual inspection plus regular chimney sweeps, ash removal and wood storage.
COST	Installation of a gas line is expensive, but propane setups are cheaper. Operating costs depend on natural gas/propane prices.	Often cheaper to build initially. Ongoing costs include purchasing firewood unless you cut your own.
